2 CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The WAVE expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The WAVE urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

7 CLASSIFICATIONS

The V. World Championship of Working Equitation comprises 4 trials (Dressage, Ease of Handling, Speed and Cow Trial) and has three different classifications.

7.1 CLASSIFICATION 1 - TEAM WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Each competing country (represented for its national equestrian federation or national organization recognized by WAVE) submits a team of 4 riders, selected nationally and representing the traditional equitation of the country in question.

The riders must have the passport of the country they represent.

WAVE in accordance with the national federation or national organization recognized by WAVE cannot authorize a participation of a rider that competed in non-WAVE competitions in the same year.

A rider that, from 2017 on, has already competed in a championship for one nation, is not allowed to participate later for other nations.

The classification is based on the total number of points scored in accordance with a Score Chart (see Appendix 1 of the current regulations of WAVE) for the 3 best team performances in question in each of the 4 championship trials. In case of a team competing only with 3 riders, all their results count for the team classification.

After all the tests, and in case of equal number of points between teams, the tiebreak will be decided by the best total of points of each Team, in:

- 1 st – Dressage Test
- 2 nd – Maneability Test
- 3 rd – Speed Test

No country may submit more than one team.

Any substitutions will comprise both horse and rider and not either horse or rider.

7.2 CLASSIFICATION 2 - INDIVIDUAL WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

An individual classification based on the performance of competitors in the first three trials (Dressage, Ease of Handling and Speed).

This classification will be based on the results achieved by competitors belonging to a National Team and wearing the traditional Working Equitation costume of the respective country, i.e. team members and reserves.

0 (zero) points will be awarded to any competitor disqualified in any trial.

The general classification will be ordered as follows:

1. Number of trial completions.
2. Highest number of points.

After all the individual Tests, and in case of equal number of points, the tiebreak for the higher places will be decided by the best result of each rider, in:

- 1 st – Dressage Test
- 2 nd – Maneability Test
- 3 rd – Speed Test

Countries not having a minimum number of competitors sufficient to comprise a team (3) may compete in individual trials only.

7.3 CLASSIFICATION 3 - COW TRIAL WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

An independent collective classification, only for the result of the cow trial test.

8 CEREMONIES

The prize giving ceremony for each of the 3 tests Dressage Trial, Maneability Trial and Speed Trial will take place at the end of each Trial, for the top 5 riders on horsebacks.

The final prize giving ceremony will take place on Sunday at arena 15.
All riders on horseback.

12.2 HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

General

In accordance with the Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse it is imperative that all horses at events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

Entry of horses

Required health tests and vaccinations: ./.

Every athlete is obliged to deliver all necessary health certificates for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a health attestation for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex II to COUNCIL DIRECTIVE 2009/156/EC (see <http://eurlex.europa.eu/legal-content/EN/TXT/PDF/?uri=CELEX:32009L0156&from=DE>) of the currently valid version will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not belonging to the EU, a health certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex II (see <https://www.bmel.de/DE/Tier/TierhandelTransport/Gesundheitsbescheinigungen/texte/Pferde.html>) of the decision of the commission 92/260/EG of the currently valid version will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The Organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

12.3 NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

12.4 INJURY SURVEILLANCE

Horses participating in WAVE Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post mortem examination.

12.5 TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

12.6 VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

12.6.1 PASSPORTS

For horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations.

12.6.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA

Horses competing at international WAVE Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below:

All Horses intending to compete at the Event must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory

12.6.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL

On arrival at an Event venue, all horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

12.6.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS

All horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

12.6.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION

All horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of horses at an event.

12.7 EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)

12.7.1 SAMPLING

All horses competing at WAVE Events may be subject to sampling for the presence Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures.

12.7.2 ELECTIVE TESTING

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances. Please refer to <http://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/veterinarians> for information and details.

13 HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any WAVE Event, by the WAVE or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with testing jurisdiction.

14 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

14.1 INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Horse sport is associated with dangerous risks. The WAVE, WED e.V. and the organizer of this tournaments shall NOT be liable for material and property damages or injuries of any kind whatsoever in the case of participants, owners, assistants and spectators who are in connection with the WAVE or with a WAVE event.

The WAVE and the WED e.V. expressly excludes all liability.

14.1.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

14.1.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at WAVE Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a WAVE Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in WAVE Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at WAVE Events.

14.1.1.2 Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an WAVE Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

14.1.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

14.1.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance

As an athlete/owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to WAVE Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The WAVE and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses

14.1.2.2 Additional Liability Information

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements.

14.1.2.3 Horse Insurance

As an owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a WAVE Event.

14.2 PROTESTS/APPEALS

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of € 100.-.

14.3 DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

14.4 MODIFICATION TO SCHEDULE

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the WAVE Board of Directors and the Ground Jury, the OC may change the schedule in order to clarify any matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible.

14.5 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE ORGANISER

14.5.1 REGULATIONS

International Working Equitation Regulations 2017

14.5.2 TIMETABLE

The times stated under "6 Timetable" are subject to alterations.

14.5.3 GERMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ACT

According to paragraph 6 of the German Animal Welfare Act, trimming the vibrissae around eyes and muzzle as well as clipping or cutting the hairs inside the ears of horses are prohibited.

14.5.4 HORSES

The horses must be marked with bridle numbers at all times on the event grounds.

14.5.5 ATHLETES

For all athletes under the age of 18, helmets are required on the event grounds. It is generally recommended to wear a helmet.

14.5.6 DOGS

Dogs have to be kept on the leash.
